

# Vaccines Protect Against Diseases

Vaccine (shot)	Use	Dose
Hepatitis virus (Hep A)	Protects against infections of the liver	Two doses needed
Hepatitis virus (Hep B)	Protects against infections of the liver	Three doses needed
Diphtheria, tetanus, and acellular pertussis (DTaP)	Protects against diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis	Five doses needed
Tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis (Tdap) booster	Protects against diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis	One dose needed
Haemophilus influenzae type B (Hib)	Protects against infections of the lungs, brain, and blood	Three to four doses needed (depending on brand)
Inactivated polio virus (IPV)	Protects against polio	Four doses needed
Measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR)	Protects against measles, mumps, and rubella	Two doses needed
Pneumococcal infections (PCV13)(PPV)	Protects against ear infections, pneumonia, and meningitis	Four doses needed
Meningococcal disease (MCV4)	Protects against common strains of meningitis	Two doses needed
Varicella (chickenpox)	Protects against chickenpox	Two doses needed
Influenza (flu shot)	Protects against the flu	Children ages 6 months through 8 years getting the flu shot for the first time will need two doses given at least four weeks apart. After the first year, one dose a year is needed.
Rotavirus (rota)	Protects against the most common cause of severe diarrhea among children	Three doses needed (depending on brand)
Human papillomavirus (HPV)	Protects against common causes of cervical cancer	Three doses needed
