National Prescription Drug Take Back Day will occur on Saturday, October 26 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. AmeriHealth Caritas District of Columbia (DC) requests that providers encourage their patients to take the opportunity to remove unneeded medications from their homes.

National Prescription Drug Take Back Day is a measure for preventing medication misuse and opioid use disorder. There will be 13 collection sites across the District. DC Prevention Centers and faith-based community members will be at each of the collection sites providing information about community resources.
